New Picnic Shelter Opened at Schuetzen Park

The "Jens Lorenzen - Pavillion" was completed the second week of May and immediately had its first event on May 18th. Two groups from St. Marks Lutheran Church in west Davenport were the first to take advantage of the new 20 x 32 ft shelter.

As reported in the spring edition of the Schuetzen-Brief, Mr. Lorenzen was a foremost member of the Davenport Schützenverein. Mr. Lorenzen deserves this place of honor as it was he, in 1868, who loaned the Schützenverein the money to purchase the land we know as Schuetzen Park.
