Community Restoration Program Continues Projects in Park

A program begun in 2004 by the Scott County Sheriff's office is making great progress on a couple fronts in the Park. Participants of the "Community Restoration" program helped remove invasive honeysuckle from the park last fall. This winter, participants have been spreading cinders donated by the City of Davenport on the Park's trails. Both projects will greatly enhance the beauty and usefulness of the Park. Since May of 2005, more than 398 man hours have been donated by this program to the Park. We thank all involved in these projects for their generous assistance.

Jens Lorenzen Pavillion gets lit!

Thanks to a generous gift from the German American Family Club, the Jens Lorenzen Pavilion will be wired for electricity by the time the Park opens for the 2006 season. The project will include lighting for the kitchen, storage area and picnic table. Electrical outlets will be added for use during events. A grant from the Riverboat Development Authority in 2005 secured a generator for the Park, which will power the Pavillion's electrical system. In the future, the grove in front of the Pavillion will be lit like the "Electric Parks" of 1900, with strings of colored lights!

Prairie Demonstration Hillside

Eagle Scout candidate Jeff Rice spent a weekend last fall working to invigorate our landscape. Jeff, of Troop 82 based at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Bettendorf, along with members of Troops 24 & 82, cleared and planted native Iowa prairie plants on the once weedy hillside next to the Jens Lorenzen Pavillion. Plants include wild petunia, purple prairie clover, Blackwell Switchgrass, to name a few. Jeff hopes that the prairie will serve to help beautify the Park, as well as stop erosion and inform people about natural Iowa prairies. To complete his Eagle project, Jeff and the other scouts also built and placed four large bat houses throughout the Park, to give our large bat population a place to live. Ernst Otto Returns to Schuetzen Park

Wells Fargo Bank will help bring back the music of Prof. Ernst Otto: Teacher, Composer & Musician. The Bank, along with the Schützenpark Gilde, will present a "Concert for Kids & Seniors" on June 2nd. Otto was born in Schönwalde. Schleswig-Holstein/Germany in 1862. He came to the U.S. at

Holstein/Germany in 1862. He came to the U.S. at the age of 17. Among his many accomplishments was the creation of his own band - Otto's Orchestra and Military Band. Otto performed at the Schuetzen Park, as well as other locations, for many years.

Prof. Otto was the director of music for the Davenport Public Schools from 1895-1920. He directed many choruses, including one of 2000 children at one of Davenport's many Sängerfests. More than 50 compositions are credited to Otto. 10 compositions will be heard at the June 2 concert.

Local vocalists Susan McPeters and Brian Nelson, along with pianist Mark Prebyl, will perform at the event. While the morning concert for school children is not open to the public, the 1:30 p.m. program is a public performance.
