Was given in Connection with Field Meet of the Upper Classes of the Davenport Turngemeinde

A children's festival and bird shoot of the Davenport Turngemeinde was held Thursday, June 29, 1911 at Schuetzen Park in connection with the field meet of the upper classes of the society.

A parade was held at 9:00am starting at the Turner Hall. Following the parade, special street cars were taken to the Park where the

day's program of sports commenced.

There was bird shooting and various other sports for the children and a field meet and other contests by the upper classes. A large number of visiting Turners from Clinton and various other points attended.

A concert was given in the afternoon by one of the local bands and a dance was held in the evening. The King and Queen were crowned at 6:00 o'clock with appropriate ceremonies.

"The Turners practiced hard for the meet and expected to break some records."
